

## **Update by the Numbers:**

New Traps Deployed (since January 1, 2025): 854
Total traps deployed (November 13, 2025 – December 3, 2025): 0
Hornets found (November 13, 2025 – December 3, 2025): 676
Nests found & eradicated (November 13, 2025 – December 3, 2025): 5
Total nests found & eradicated (August 2023 – December 3, 2025): 115

- 2025: 4 embryo nests, 5 primary nests, 53 secondary nests
- 2024: 4 embryo nests, 3 primary nests, 41 secondary nests
  - Total: 48
- 2023: 5 secondary nests

## Hornet Season Update: 115 Nests Eradicated

Since our last issue, the Plant Protection team has successfully eradicated five additional nests in the Savannah area. This brings the total to 115 eradicated nests since the Yellow-Legged Hornet was first detected in Georgia in 2023.

Although we are nearing the end of the Yellow-Legged Hornet season, our team continues to actively search for new nests. We ask beekeepers to remain vigilant and watch for hawking behavior—hornets hovering near hive entrances and capturing foraging bees.
